October has a wonderfully Lutheran rhythm to it: old roots, new beginnings, plenty of music, and just enough red stuff to make sure nobody forgets it's Reformation season.

Here at Emmanuel's, our choirs are back and finding their rhythm again. There is something wonderful about hearing our worship fill back up with voices after the quieter pace of summer. Choir is more than decoration for worship. Singing together is one of the ways the church tells its story, prays together, and quite literally learns to breathe together.

This month also gives us some particularly joyful ways to remember that the church is always being renewed.

On **Reformation Sunday**, we will celebrate **First Communion** with some of our young people. I love that pairing. Reformation is not really a birthday party for Lutherans or a celebration of being right while somebody else was wrong. At its heart is the rediscovery of the astonishing good news that God's grace is **gift**. We don't achieve it, purchase it, or make ourselves worthy of it.

And then we will watch some of our youngest disciples come to the table and open their hands.

There may be no better Reformation sermon than that.

In Holy Communion, we gather around one of the church's means of grace: ordinary bread and wine carrying Christ's promise for ordinary, hungry people. To our First Communion families: we are delighted to celebrate this milestone with you. And to the rest of the congregation: come ready to surround these young people with the same promises and community that have carried generations before them.

October will also end with another beginning. On **October 31, Bishop Jenn Dee will be installed**, beginning a new chapter of ministry in our wider church. The ELCA's rite of installation reminds us that a bishop's ministry doesn't happen alone. The church promises to pray for its bishop and to strive together for the peace and unity of Christ. We hold Bishop Dee and all those beginning this new season of synod ministry in our prayers.

That makes October quite a month: **voices returning to the choir loft, children coming to Christ's table, a bishop beginning a new ministry, and the church once again remembering that reformation is something God keeps doing.**

The church is deeply rooted, yes. But God has never seemed particularly interested in leaving it sitting still.

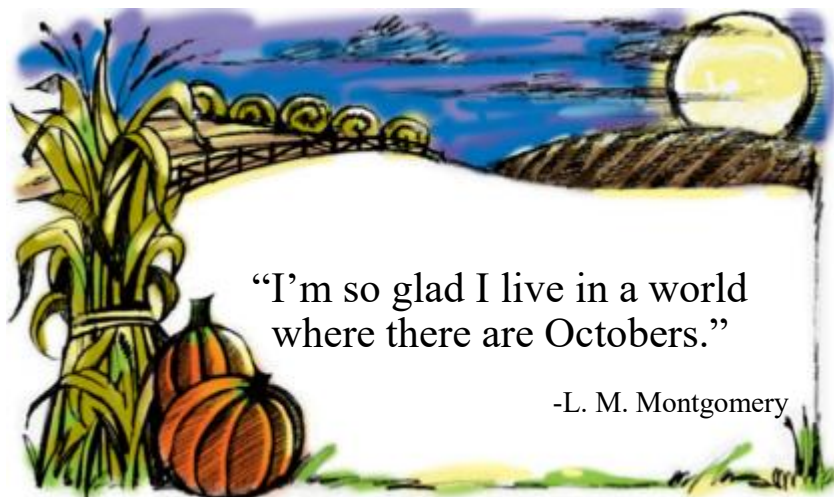

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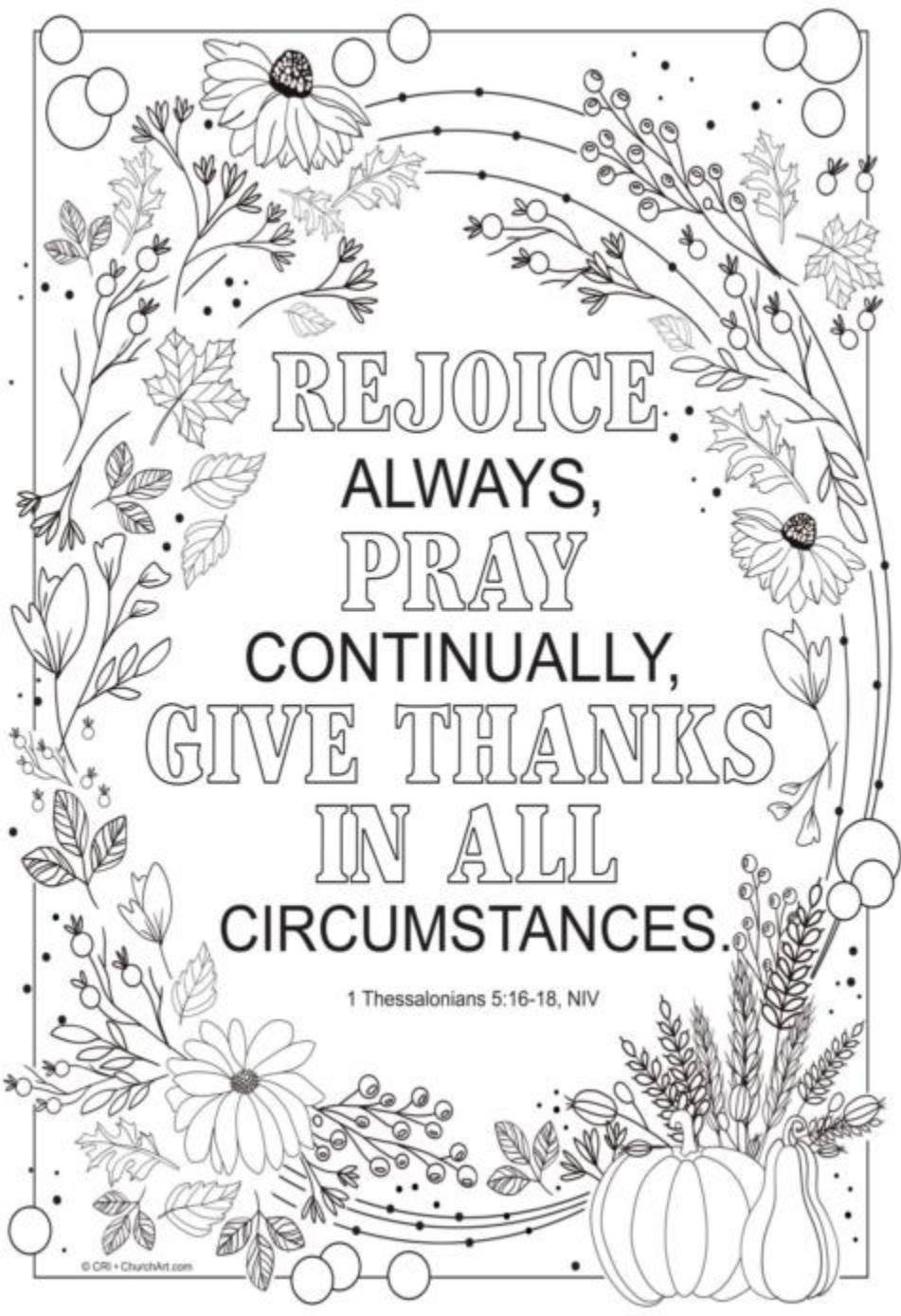

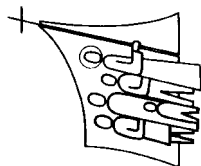
